## A BUZZIN' BUSINESS

Alex Jauregui is creating a buzz among the farming community in Northern California. Shortly after receiving his specially adapted custom HFOT home in March 2015, Alex wanted to do something useful with the five acres of land on his property. Initially he planned on planting an almond orchard, but it was too expensive. Instead, he started his own bee farm called Fury Bees due to the high demand for honeybees in the area.

Over the past four years, Alex has grown his business from 75 hives to 800. He hopes to have 4,000 beehives and expand his honey company. Alex credits his HFOT home for helping him launch his business. Having a home adapted to his injuries enables him to rest after a long day of farming, and he has ample space. "The lot the home is on provided me with the land I needed to begin the business of a commercial beekeeper," he says.

Earlier this year, Alex was recognized for his efforts in his community after he received assistance from the Farmer Veteran Coalition.

# ACCELERATING A NEW MISSION

Racing cars gave Marine Staff Sergeant Liam Dwyer the drive to overcome adversity. Losing his left leg and sustaining severe damage to his remaining limbs while serving in Afghanistan in 2011, Liam initially found the recovery process to be physically and mentally draining. Learning how to do simple tasks, such as walking on a prosthetic, took up so much of his energy, doing something as adventurous as driving over 100 miles per hour on a racetrack professionally was unimaginable.

Liam's outlook began to change while undergoing treatment at Walter Reed Medical Center, watching the progress of other amputees who were injured before him. Their positive attitudes and motivation inspired him to move forward and go after his dreams. A lifelong car enthusiast, Liam and his friends met Mazda executives at a race in 2012. The Mazda executives were impressed with Liam's ability to race cars without adaptations and two years later, he began racing for Mazada professionally. "Racing has been my biggest form of therapy. Without it, I don't know where I would be," he says.

When he's behind the wheel, Liam feels content and at ease. "Racing is about being smart and aggressive at the same time. Something about that relaxes me," he says.

Though Liam finds comfort driving on a speedway, he is constantly frustrated with the barriers he faces within his own home. He and his wife Meghan currently live in an older home, which is not accessible for Liam's wheelchair. Liam recently underwent osseointegration surgery, a procedure that inserts a titanium rod into the femur, allowing it to directly connect with the prosthetic with minimal pain. Recovering from this surgery has been challenging in their current home because Liam must keep his leg fully extended, and needs assistance transferring from different rooms. Meghan constantly fears Liam will harm himself in their current environment. She and Liam cannot wait until Homes For Our Troops builds their specially adapted forever home. "To have a home that is accessible and enables Liam to have independence to complete daily living tasks, and promote functional mobility that supports his rehabilitation to gain strength is a dream come true," Meghan says. "This home means much more than a roof over our heads. Instead of just existing, we will be able to live our best lives possible."

Liam and Meghan are thrilled Homes For Our Troops will soon begin construction on their home in Lake Worth, Fla., and are grateful to the generosity of HFOT supporters who will make this possible. "The stress relief and the dreams you will enable us to achieve have no way to be measured," Liam says. "Please know we will always have an open door for you to see first-hand what your kindness and charity have helped us to achieve."
