A Letter from the President and CEO

Dear HFOT Supporters,

As the anniversary of 9/11 approaches, we are mindful of the nearly 3,000 lives lost on that September day. We remember and honor those who put themselves in harm's way and extend our gratitude to the brave men and women in our military who serve our country.



Many of the Veterans we serve at HFOT were inspired to join or re-enlist after the September 11 attacks, stepping forward selflessly to protect our nation. They were severely injured while defending our freedom, returning home to lives forever changed and to non-adapted living arrangements no longer safe or accessible. Based on U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs numbers, we estimate that there are still over 1,000 severely injured post-9/11 Veterans in need of adapted housing. This is why our mission is so critical.

As we celebrate our 20th anniversary and hand over the keys to our 400th home this month, we remain steadfast in our resolve to build and donate a specially adapted custom home for every post-9/11 severely injured Veteran who qualifies for one. These homes help restore some of the freedom and independence our Veterans sacrificed for all of us, so we could continue to enjoy our daily freedoms. We can only do this with your continued commitment to our mission. Your generosity fuels our organization and propels us forward.

In this newsletter, you can see how you are impacting the lives of HFOT Veterans and their families. On page 3, we introduce you to Air Force Technical Sergeant Adam Popp, a marathoner and elite para-athlete who is looking forward to moving into his HFOT home in Colorado with his wife, Amanda, and 2-year-old son, Logan. 

Quality of Life



Adam Popp joined the Air Force directly after graduating high school in 1997, influenced by his desire to carry on his family's legacy of military service. He found a sense of purpose in his job as an Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD) Team Leader. "I took great pride in my ability to contribute to missions

that made a tangible difference to the safety of my fellow service members and the local populations," he says.

The safety of others was Adam's primary concern on his second combat deployment in 2007 when he was tasked with disarming a roadside improvised explosive device (IED) in Paktia Province, Afghanistan. He was successful in neutralizing the initial threat, but a secondary IED detonated, resulting in the amputation of his right leg above the knee.

In the aftermath of his injury, Adam struggled with his loss of mobility. "In a split second, I went from being very fit and independent to near death lying in a hospital bed, relying on others. Everyday tasks became challenging, and I worried about my ability to move freely and independently without risking further injury." After more than a year of rehabilitation at Walter Reed Medical Center, he faced continued challenges in his multilevel home with steep staircases to the bedrooms on the top floor, and laundry in the basement.


Now future recipients of a specially adapted custom HFOT home, Adam, and his wife, Amanda, are looking forward to joining the Lafayette, Colorado community where they've chosen to build their new home, and raise their young son, Logan and their daughter, due this November. The choice to build their HFOT home in the Centennial State, known for its stunning natural landscape and appeal to outdoor enthusiasts, complements Adam's active lifestyle. A seventime Guinness World Record holder, he became the first above-knee amputee to complete a 100-mile ultramarathon. He won the 2024 Boston Marathon's Para Elite T63/63 division and set a world record at the London Marathon just six days later.

Yet what Adam is looking forward to most is the freedom and independence he'll have in the single-level, open floor plan of his new home. "Receiving an HFOT home will significantly improve my quality of life by providing a living space that is tailored to my specific needs. Features like wider doorways, lowered countertops, and accessible

bathrooms will enable me to navigate my home safely and comfortably. Additionally, this will allow me to grow old in my home while making it easier to chase my young kiddos around without worrying about going up and down stairs with them, which is one of my biggest concerns currently."

The mortgage-free home will give Adam the opportunity to pursue a career change and utilize his master's degrees in Rehabilitation and Clinical Counseling from George Washington University and Sport & Performance Psychology from the University of Denver. He will also be able to continue to pay it forward through his participation in the EOD Warrior Foundation, the VA Veterans' Advisory Committee on Rehabilitation, and as a certified peer-mentor and peer-mentor trainer through the Amputee Coalition of America.

Adam would like to extend his deepest gratitude to HFOT donors and supporters. "Your generosity and support have a profound impact on the lives of Veterans like myself, providing us with the stability and resources needed to thrive. This home will not only transform my life but also profoundly impact my children. They will see firsthand the difference that your kindness makes, which I hope will inspire them to grow into compassionate individuals who serve their fellow humans. Your contribution helps build a future filled with hope and opportunity, not just for me but for my entire family. Thank you for making a difference and for believing in the potential of Veterans to continue serving their communities in meaningful ways."





Dan and Jess Lasko know a thing or two about perseverance. The pair met as teenagers at a local football game, became high school sweethearts, and said a tearful goodbye

after graduation when Dan enlisted in the Marines, officially swearing in on the tragic morning of the 9/11 terrorist attacks. In the face of uncertainty, their bond never wavered.

Three years later, when Dan lost his leg in an improvised explosive device (IED) blast on a combat deployment in Afghanistan, it was Jess who spent the next year at Dan's hospital bedside while he recovered through extensive therapy and rehabilitation. "She always stuck with me," Dan says. "And that's what she continues to do, and that's what I love about her."

Back in civilian life, they continued to stick together through the many challenges they encountered in their former home, a raised ranch built into a hillside with a cramped layout. "We had so many stairs and rooms and they were all tight spaces. There was no way I could get around in a wheelchair. When I couldn't wear my prosthetic, I was either confined to the couch or the bedroom. There were times I had to crawl up the stairs and it was something I shouldn't have been doing," he says.

Recipients of a specially adapted custom HFOT home in early 2023, Dan and Jess, along with their two sons, Ben and Luke, have settled comfortably into the community in the Lehigh Valley area of Pennsylvania, the same state where they met on the bleachers at a high school football game all those years ago. Now though, the freedom and independence of their mortgage-free, single-level home with over 40 major adaptations have made daily life easier for the Lasko family, a luxury they don't take for granted. "Living comfortably in a safe place was unknown until now," Dan says.

Medically retired, Dan coaches both sons in youth sports and looks forward to new experiences and traveling as a family. He would like to thank HFOT donors and supporters for providing a safe and secure home. "Thank you so much for supporting HFOT and for the building of our home—a place my family can live without concerns or worry," he says.
